

Sherman College Pays off Mortgage

SPARTANBURG, SC - A "mortgage-burning" ceremony was held on May 25 at Sherman College of Chiropractic to celebrate paying off the school's mortgage.

The college began a mortgage fundraising campaign earlier this year. Leroy Moore, DC, Sherman's vice president for institutional advancement, sought the financial support of the regents, alumni and friends of the college, and raised the necessary \$210,000.

"Sherman College has reached a significant milestone in becoming a debt-free campus for the first time since it was founded in 1973," said Dr. Jerry Hardee, president of the college. "Becoming a debt-free campus will enable us to launch a multimillion-dollar fundraising campaign that will further ensure our future."
