Life U. to Offer Chiropractic Pediatric Certification

MARIETTA, GA - Beginning April 28, 2001, Life University will sponsor the International Chiropractic Pediatric Association's 120-hour pediatric certification program. After the completion of the first year, DCs can elect to continue their education and training to receive diplomate status, which involves an additional two years of study.

The diplomate program was designed by Claudia Anrig, past president of the ICPA, author of *Chiropractic Pediatrics*, and pediatric columnist for *Dynamic Chiropractic*. This new 240-hour program will provide the DC with pertinent information and advanced technique skills taught by a variety of speakers in an innovative manner.

Doctors previously certified within the last three years will be credited with the first 120 hours of instruction, and may begin year two of the program. DCs certified through the ICPA pediatric program more than three years ago may be required to take refresher courses to be admitted into the diplomate program's second year.
