

Governors' Club Donates \$100,000 to CMCC

TOTAL DONATIONS FROM CLUB TOP \$1 MILLION

TORONTO, Ontario, Canada -- At the 1997 homecoming of the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC), the Governors' Club donated \$100,000 to the college, bringing the total donations from the club to more than \$1 million.
