The chiropractic group must reach the membership level of 500 by August 31, 1994. If the Chiropractic Forum is able to raise its membership to 500 and maintain it for a three-year period, it can then apply for section membership. This will give the chiropractic profession the opportunity to have two seats on the APHA Governing Council, and financial support for section activities.
