Some how, there it was, two sentences of information that was not quite correct. These were the sentences:

"Though there have been no studies conducted specifically with regard to AIDS patients, some chiropractors in private practice have observed that chiropractic care has helped to improve the immune systems of some of their patients. In the context of other conditions, chiropractic care has been shown to enhance the body's ability to heal itself."

Does almost every chiropractor on earth believe this to be true? YES. Can we prove it? NO; not until we put forth the effort (and the money) to make this research a reality, can we make these kinds of statements.

But the ICA was not slow to act. Realizing that these statements would be misconstrued to ultimately bring discredit to the chiropractic profession, Ron Hendrickson, ICA's executive vice president, ordered the original brochures destroyed.
