Just Do It: 2007 Sports & Pediatrics Symposium

Doctors of chiropractic will join athletic trainers at the Nike World Campus in Beaverton, Ore., from Aug. 3-5 at the 2007 Sports & Pediatrics Symposium. Partnering to present the event are the ACA Sports Council, the ACA Pediatrics Council and the Oregon Athletic Trainers' Society. The event is being heralded as a landmark for the chiropractic profession, as it is rare that outside events are held on the Nike campus.
