The CFS is a not-for-profit organization that establishes educational and training parameters for the practice of forensics.

The CFS recognizes the American Board of Forensic Professionals (ABFP) as its certifying board. The ABFP is the only national chiropractic organization that operates and administers board certification and re-certification for forensic, impairment rating, and Department of Transportation programs. The ABFP is a member of the National Organization for Competency Assurance (NOCA). The CFS offers [its own guideline of conduct](#) for its members.
