ACA, Specialty Councils to Host Inaugural Symposium This Fall

The American Chiropractic Association (ACA) is collaborating with four of its specialty councils and one specialty college to bring the chiropractic profession a new and exciting event: the Chiropractic Symposium & Expo 2009. The inaugural event will take place Oct. 30 - Nov. 1 at the Hyatt Regency Riverfront in St. Louis, Mo. This event marks the first time ACA's councils have collaborated to offer the profession access to their cutting-edge education programs.
