Northwestern Names New Dean of Chiropractic College

Renee DeVries, DC, DACBR, has been named dean of the College of Chiropractic at Northwestern Health Sciences University. A 1989 graduate of Northwestern, Dr. DeVries is an associate professor and has worked for the university for 16 years. She has also served as chair of the department of diagnostic imaging and director of radiology consulting.

"I feel very honored to be named Dean of the College of Chiropractic," said Dr. DeVries. "As a graduate of Northwestern and a longtime faculty member, I have strong loyalty to this institution.
