Palmer Receives Two Huge Donations

Palmer College of Chiropractic is the recipient of two generous donations – one for \$3 million and the other for \$1 million. The \$3 million donation, courtesy of 1951 graduate William Kiernan, DC, is the largest single donation from a living alumnus in school history. The new Experiential Learning Center, which opened in December 2022, has been renamed the William J. & Mary A. Kiernan Hall – Anatomy & Technique Center in honor of Dr. Kiernan and his late wife.

The \$1 million donation, by 1977 graduate Paul Hetrick, DC, will be used to expand the college's Sports and Rehabilitation Residency program, touted by the college as the longest-standing program of its kind in the nation.
